#### Morning Drop Off and End of Day Collection Routines

As we move through the Prime Minister's road map for recovery, we at school have been reviewing the current drop off and collection routines, to ensure that we continue to provide safe, well socially distanced protocols. Therefore we would like to make some changes to our current system, ready for Tuesday 4th May. We would like to open up the use of the front and back playground, giving adults more space to ensure they maintain 2m of distance at all times. We continue to ask you to wear masks.

Please note that we are still unable to invite parents into the school building, and therefore access will be limited to the playgrounds. This also means that we unfortunately, we still need to ask some parents to walk around to the different collection points, as moving though the school premises underneath the canopies will not be possible at this time. We appreciate that this is adding to some parents' morning routine, and as soon as we can remove this measure of safety, we of course will. Sibling arrangements will remain unchanged.

We will be operating a one-way system in the front playground. Please enter the playground through the gate on the corner of the playground, and exit through the 'avenue' and main office gate. To keep the office staff safe and ensure social distancing please do not visit the office unless a face to face discussion is needed (i.e. dropping of medicine) and continue to email <a href="mailto:admin@toddstg.co.uk">admin@toddstg.co.uk</a> for general, medical or absence queries, or the Year Group emails for work or classroom related queries (teachers can not read emails during the day whilst teaching, so any time critical information, such as pick up arrangements should be sent to the admin address).

In terms of timings, we have not changed the times, as we understand the importance of family planning the logistical operations that is drop-off and pick up. However, I did want to give parents plenty of notice that we do hope to return to the pre-covid timings of 8.50am drop off and for Reception: 3.15pm; Year 1 & 2: 3.20pm, and Year 3 & 4: 3.25pm pick ups, for September 2021, road map allowing.

#### First Aid

First aid letters will now only be sent home, for more serious cuts or grazes, and for all head bumps. All other first aid, such as small cuts and grazes, will be dealt with at the time, by the named first aider in the bubble. This will reduce the amount of children needing to travel through school to the medical room.
