Her passion for teaching has inspired her own family with her daughter following in her footsteps and taking on her own career in the classroom, even following her to work in St. Georges too so we recently had three generations of Jackie's family in the school – herself teaching in Nursery, her Daughter (Mrs Gemma Rivers) teaching in year 2 and her granddaughter being in year 4. A truly unique and beautiful memory.

Jackie has not only been a fantastic teacher but a valued colleague, her calming presence and caring nature has meant she has often been the person to lean on in times of need and her experience, mentoring and wisdom will be missed by the whole staffing team.

As Mrs Stringer prepares to bid farewell to her teaching career, we stand in awe of her incredible contributions and the profound impact she has had on the lives of so many. Her unwavering dedication, innovative teaching methods, and heartfelt commitment to her students have left an enduring legacy. 


We have recently started a programme to improve opportunities for physical activity, socialisation, cooperation, coordination, resilience, creativity, imagination and enjoyment through improved play.

It is based on the idea that as well as learning through good teaching, your children also learn when they play, and as 20% of their time in school is playtime, we want to make sure that this amount of time (equivalent to 1.4 years of primary school) is as good as possible.

The benefits of play

- cognitive skills like math and problem solving in a pretend grocery store
- physical abilities like fundamental skills, balancing and travelling on the playground
- fitness expending more energy and effort as they explore and engage in active play
- new vocabulary like the words they need to play with toy dinosaurs
- social skills like playing together in a pretend car wash
- literacy skills like creating a menu for a pretend restaurant

Sit down together

For parents, the summer holidays are a great chance to sit down with your children. Together you can visit their favourite sites and play their favourite games, this is a great way to stay up to date with online lives and show them that you're interested in what they are doing.

The holidays are also a good opportunity to have positive conversations about the internet, so if something ever does upset your child online they would feel more confident in confiding in you. <u>Our conversation starters</u> are a great tool to help encourage an open dialogue with your child.

Social media and staying in touch

During the summer holidays, young people may want to keep in touch with their friends through social networking sites or games. It's a good time to ask them about what sites they use, and check any age requirements as many social media sites require users to be at least 13 years old

Encourage your children to use the privacy tools on the services they use, so that the content they post is only available to people they know and trust in real life. To help your children set these up, we have <u>a guide to the privacy settings on the different sites</u>. You can also download the UK Safer Internet Centre's <u>safety checklists for popular sites</u> such as Instagram, Snapchat and Facebook
